What to do to start your claim process

Use this document if you own a condominium (divided co-ownership) in Quebec and need to make an insurance claim for a loss in your unit.

What to do

- ✓ Take photos of the damage
- ✓ Tell other condo owners who are also affected to contact their insurers
- ✓ Notify an administrator from your condominium syndicate so that they can contact the insurer for the condominium building
- ✓ Find out the cause:
- ✓ Get a copy of your declaration of co-ownership
